## Schedule of Classes

### Vegetables

Vegetables should be clean. Cabbage and Lettuce should have any caterpillar eaten leaves removed, pea and bean stems should be cut neatly.

1. Four Carrots – foliage trimmed 2” above the crown.
2. Two Lettuce
3. Six Pea Pods
4. Six French Beans
5. Six Runner Beans – straight & level
6. Three Potatoes – medium sized, of good shape & equally matched.
7. Three Onions under 8oz – with tied tops & skin on.
8. Three Onions over 8oz – with tied tops & skin on.
9. Five Tomatoes – with stalks left on & equally matched.
10. Five Cherry Tomatoes – with stalks left on.
11. One Frame Cucumber
12. One Ridge Cucumber
13. Three Courgettes – with or without flowers & under 6”
14. Bunch of Five Mixed Garden Herbs – one sprig of each herb tied in a bunch.
15. Any other vegetable not specified.

### Fruit

Soft Fruit should be displayed with stalks attached.

16. Eight Raspberries.
17. Six Plums.
18. Three Dessert Apples.
19. Three Cooking Apples.
20. Any other fruit not specified.

## Flowers

21. Rose – Hybrid Tea, One Bloom.
22. Rose – Hybrid Tea, One Bloom of Each of Three Varieties.
23. Rose, Climbing, One Bloom.
24. Sweet Peas – Six Stems of One Colour.
25. Sweet Peas – Six Stems of Mixed Colours.
26. Annual Garden Flowers – Five Stems of One Variety or Mixed.
27. Pelargonium or Geranium – Three Stems of Any Variety.
28. Dahlias – Any Variety.
29. Vase of Mixed Flowers – Between Three and Eight Varieties.
30. Any Single Flower or Spray not specified.
31. Arrangement of Three Blooms – Any Kind, With Foliage.
32. Arrangement of Ornamental Grasses.
33. Miniature Flower Arrangement – No Larger than 4" Square.
34. Any other Blooms.

35. One Cactus or other Succulent
36. One Flower Plant
37. One Foliage Plant

## Handicraft

38. Needlework
39. Knitted and/or Crochet Item
40. Woodwork and/or Metalwork

4. No exhibit is to be removed until after prize giving.
5. The judge's decision shall be final.
6. The Unicorn will take reasonable precautions to look after the exhibitor's property, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
7. Closing date for completed entry forms: Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> August. No late entries will be accepted.
8. Please ensure all entries in the Junior Classes are the unaided work of the competitor, parental guidance is of course permitted.
